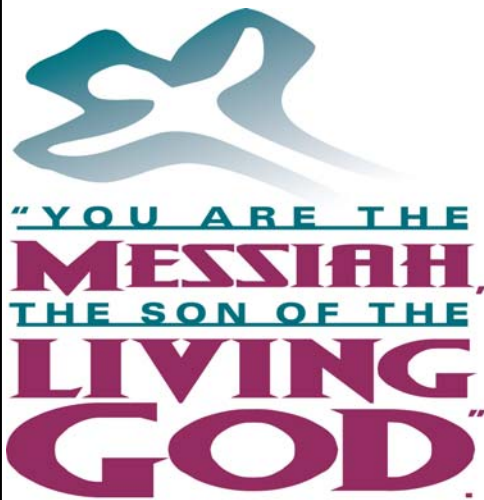
RANDALL'S RAMBLINGS

WHO DO YOU SAY JESUS IS?

If asked the question, "Who do you say Jesus is?" what would your answer be?

Matthew records Peter's answer to that question this way, "When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' They replied, 'Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' 'But what about you?' he asked. 'Who do you say I am?' Simon Peter answered, 'You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God.'" Matthew 16:13-16.

This was Peter's first recognition of Jesus as the promised Christ or Redeemer or Savior. This was the first recognition by any of the early disciples of truly who Jesus was. Peter finally knew who this Jesus was. With that recognition came a greater understanding of Jesus' ministry and teaching. Peter had his times of "forgetfulness" when he denied Jesus three times, when he fled before Jesus' crucifixion, and more. But, even with his "forgetfulness," he did know who Jesus truly was (and is). After Jesus' resurrection, while Peter and the others were fishing, it was Peter who recognized Jesus on the shore. Peter jumped in and swam to shore. Jesus re-commissioned Peter to "feed His sheep." Peter knew who Jesus truly was and he served Jesus the rest of his life.



Matthew 16:16, NRSV

As a part of the Body of Christ, I believe, if asked the question, "Who do you say I am?" we would easily and quickly be able to answer, "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God." Friends - the answer to this question is the capstone of our Lord's ministry through His church called The Village. We know who Jesus of the Bible is, who we are in our relationship to Him, and, as a result, we know why we are a church.

Some may ask, "Isn't Jesus the capstone of all churches?" "Why is this such a big deal?" Clearly, Jesus, of Scripture, should be the center of every church. Unfortunately, that is not always the case. Some churches place social and political involvement ahead of Jesus. Others place the style and/or order of worship as more important than Jesus. Some churches place their building higher than Jesus. And some, believe it or not, place their Pastor as more critical than Jesus.

As individuals and as a church, it is the Christ of Scripture that is the focus. All else flows from Him and His teachings. Like Peter, we are growing in our understanding of Jesus and His desire for us as individuals and as a church. And like Peter, at times we may have been "forgetful" and made our mistakes, our sins. But, we know that because of the price Jesus paid on our behalf on the cross, we are forgiven.

As your Pastor, I am truly blessed to minister with you. Blessed because we know whose we are - Jesus Christ. And we know what He wants for us and from us as individuals and as His church - to share Christ, to grow in Christ and to follow His teachings.

With that focus we are able to focus on "Go Where Jesus Leads." Isn't that what He has called us to do? It is a blessing to be able answer, "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God" and we will go!

PRESBYTERIAN POLITY PRIMER

Basic Governance

The word “presbyterian” comes from a Greek word meaning “Elder.” Our denomination and churches are run by Elders - not Pastors, Bishops and Popes. Lay leaders have at least an equal voice and vote in decisions relating to churches and the denomination. We are not a denomination run by the clergy. In The Village Church there are ten Elders on Session, our leadership body, and Pastor Dick has just one of those votes.

Our Presbyterian form of church governance is very similar to our nation’s. We elect our representatives and they make virtually all the decisions. In the case of our church, we elect Elders, also known as ruling Elders, to be our representatives.

Our theological tradition holds that it is our Lord who has called these folks to serve in leadership. This call is affirmed through our Nominating Committee and our congregation in the election. These individuals are ordained with the same basic vows taken by Ministers of Word and Sacrament, who are also known as teaching Elders, or simply Pastors.

These Elders serve specific terms on Session. The Pastor moderates meetings of the Session. Session members are called to seek our Lord’s will for His church. They are not called to simply reflect the will of the church members, but to truly seek our Lord’s will.

Most of the time, fortunately, the desires of the congregation and the will of God are similar. But there are times when the Session discerns a need or action which some in the congregation may not fully embrace. Ultimately, it is the Session, and not the congregational members, who are called to seek and follow God’s will for the future of the church.

The Session makes all the decisions relating to the church with the exception of determining who are the leaders, the calling of the Pastor, the terms of call of the Pastor and issues relating to property. The members of the congregation make these decisions.

SESSION SUMMARY

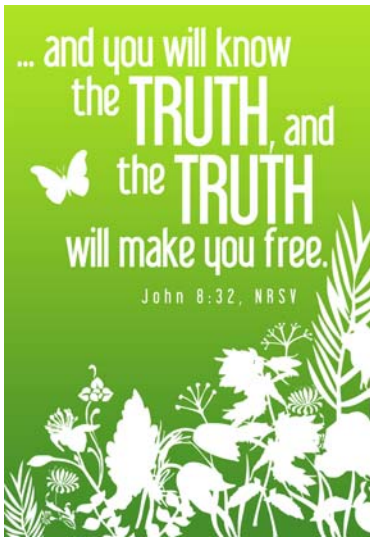
Our Session gathered on Monday evening December 12th for prayer and other business. Our newly elected folks, Ellen Castator, Pam McQueen and John Taylor, joined the meeting as well. John presented information about Financial Peace University class he and Renee will be leading starting in February. The minutes of our November Session meeting as well as our December congregational meeting were approved. Session designated a portion of Pastor Dick’s salary as housing allowance for IRS purposes. An increase of three point five percent in our Preschool tuition was approved. This was the first increase in a number of years. Our Personnel Committee will begin evaluation interviews with staff. Our leadership was blessed with four highly qualified individuals indicating a desire to serve our Lord as Church Treasurer. Renee Taylor was elected as she had the business experience as well as serving on Session and in our Presbytery. Some maintenance items were noted in our Fireside Room kitchen which will be attended to shortly.

Bedford Holmes and John Taylor were elected as our Presbytery commissioners. Our voting commissioners from our church are Renee Taylor, Ann Schofield, Tony Conragan and Pastor Dick. Craig Biddle was elected Session Clerk and check signers were approved as well. Pastor Dick continued the dialogue with Session about our denomination and Biblical authority. Alternative denominations were discussed including the Fellowship of Presbyterians. Their initial drafts of polity and theological essentials were shared with Session. John Taylor and Pastor Dick will be attending a Fellowship gathering in Orlando in January.

Session approved on a three month trial basis a new NA group to use our church facilities on Sunday evenings.

Session reviewed our Visioning Team’s Report at their November meeting. Initial approval of this report is expected at our January meeting. Session will provide further opportunities for congregational review and comment prior to the final adoption and implementation of the Visioning Team’s Report.

Pastor Dick and Session discussed his performance at their October meeting. At that time Session affirmed and expressed appreciation for our Lord’s ministry through Pastor Dick as a preacher, worship leader, Pastor and administrator. Session unanimously discerned that the October discussion was his evaluation for 2011.



HAPPY NEW YEAR!

The New Year is here and the youth programs will be looking to do some amazing things this year. Through the winter, the High School youth will be visiting the homeless in Reno to bring warm clothes and blankets donated by our church family and the Presbyterian Women's thrift shop. This ministry is amazing and so appreciated by the people who receive the gifts. We are always able to point the people to Jesus. There are always people to pray for and listen to. I can't think of a better way to help the young people appreciate what they have. If you would like to help, please bring your donations to the church during the week or on Sundays.

The Middle School youth group Brothers and Sisters in Christ, "B.A.S.I.C.", meets on Wednesdays from 6-8 p.m. We have music, food and prayer. The Youth are now almost totally in charge of leading worship music, sharing their gifts and talents. This is not your typical Sunday service. If you don't like loud and fast worship songs, you will be uncomfortable for large parts of this! The Middle School boys' Bible study is returning in January after a break. We have done some restructuring and I wrote a new mission statement for this ministry and I am really excited about it. This group was been known to be a little too physical in the past and that has been addressed and changed. I have a huge heart for Middle School boys probably because of all that happened to me in my life at that age. These young men need to know when a man looks like "Jesus", and they need to have people lead them in that direction. The name of the group, which is a part of Wyldlife, (Younglife), is "H.E.R.O. s". H.E.R.O.s stands for honor, encouragement, respect and obedience. If young men learn these things from God's word and the example of Jesus Christ, they will become real men and heroes in this world.

My wife, and other female leaders will be helping me in this new group. We will be meeting on Monday evenings from 5-7 p.m. in the church youth room. 

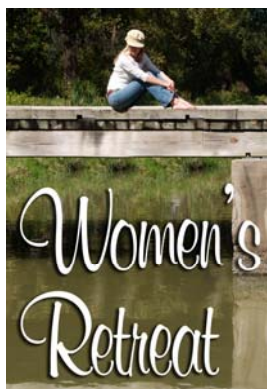
FINANCIAL PEACE UNIVERSITY

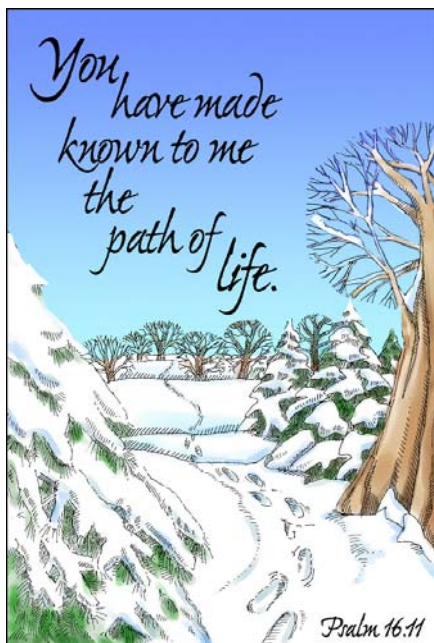
